College Partners in Teacher Quality Grant for Local K-8 Teachers

Coastal Georgia and the University of West Georgia are collaborating in a project to improve interdisciplinary science instruction through student-centered service-learning projects. Dr. Timothy Goodale, Assistant Professor of Education for the College's School of Education and Teacher Preparation, received word last week the project was awarded \$33,227 in funding through the U.S. Department of Education "Improving Teacher Quality Higher Education" grant program administered by the University of Georgia's College of Education.

Dr. Goodale and Dr. Michael Hazelkorn, Professor of Special Education, Department of Collaborative Support and Intervention, University of West Georgia, jointly applied for the grant in November 2010 and will serve as project directors. Other participating organizations include the Georgia Sea Turtle Center, Gray's Reef National Marine Sanctuary, Little St. Simons Island, and Glynn County schools.
