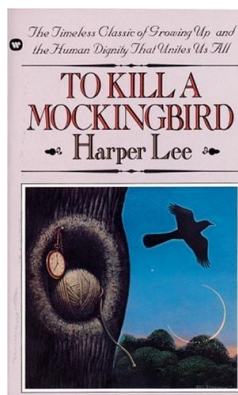

Dr. Timothy Mescon is the next speaker in College Lecture Series

The College of Coastal Georgia is pleased to announce the lecture series *Transforming the College: Lessons from Leaders* in the Thomas Auditorium at the Southeast Georgia Conference Center. The next in a series of four the monthly lectures will be held Friday, February 13, 2009 at 2:00 p.m. Guest speaker is Dr. Timothy Mescon, President, Columbus State University, lecturing on, *Vision and Focus: Building Georgia's Largest Business School*.

Dr. Mescon is the fourth president of Columbus State University. As an educator, Mescon's guidance at the Coles College of Business, with the support of the Board of Regents, created Kennesaw State's first three Eminent Scholar Chairs. He serves as a faculty member at the Stonier School of Banking and on the Advisory Board of the Kingston University School of Business and Law in the United Kingdom. Dr. Mescon was the inaugural dean of the Perdue School of Business at Salisbury University, in Salisbury, Maryland. He received his Ph.D. in Strategic Management/Entrepreneurship from the University of Georgia (1979), an MBA from Southern Methodist University (1976) and a bachelor's degree in Sociology from Tulane University (1975).

Dr. Joe Chapman has presented numerous solo piano recitals in Georgia and throughout the Southeast, including performances for public radio and television. He has toured the United States and eight foreign countries as conductor, accompanist (piano and organ) and soloist.

Beyond his expertise at the keyboard, Dr. Chapman is also active as an arranger and

composer. A professor of music at North Georgia College & State University, he serves as director of Keyboard Studies and coordinator of the NGCSU All American Piano Celebration. He also teaches courses in music theory.

The event will be presented Feb. 5 at the Southeast Georgia Conference Center, Brunswick campus, and on Feb. 6 at the Camden Center auditorium.

Admission is free and open the community. The presentations start at 7 p.m.

College of Coastal Georgia hosts African American Literature Read-In event

The Big Read is an initiative of the National Endowment for the Arts, designed to restore reading to the center of American culture. A 2004 report by the National Endowment for the Arts, found that literary reading in America is declining rapidly among all groups at an accelerated rate, especially among the young.

The Big Read aims to address this crisis and includes innovative reading programs in selected cities and towns, comprehensive resources for discussing classic literature, an ambitious national publicity campaign, and an extensive website providing comprehensive information on authors and their works.

Each community event lasts approximately one month and includes a kick-off event to launch the program locally.

The NEA inaugurated The Big Read as a pilot project in 2006 with ten communities featuring four books. The Big Read continues to expand to include more communities and additional books. By 2009, approximately 400 communities in the U.S. will have hosted a Big Read since the program's 2007 national launch.
