Woodbine Writer's Workshop

The Woodbine Cultural Arts Center Project in conjunction with the Georgia Council for the Arts will be conducting Writers' Workshops this year.

Starting in November a series of four performances along with three workshops per performance will be conducted in Woodbine. The workshops and performances will be conducted on Sundays at 2 pm. The first series of workshops began on Sunday, November 16 and the next two workshops in the series will be held on November 30 and December 14. Three more sets of workshops will be conducted in the spring of 2009 finishing in June. After each set of three workshops, there will be a performance.

Minority Outreach Program helps Glynn County Male Youth

Combating the low level of post-secondary education in Georgian African American males, the College of Coastal Georgia began an effort in 1993 known as the Coastal Georgia Minority Outreach Program (CGMOP). CGMOP is intended to target rising seventh grade African American youths who are already performing two or more grade levels below others in their age group through a drop-out intervention program. Since beginning, participants have improved up to 30 percent in the areas of math and language arts.

Monday through Friday for five weeks, 80 boys who are rising seventh graders participate in the educational program. On Fridays, participants experience cultural enrichment and personal development with field trips, including a visit to Superior Court where an African American judge who works closely with the College has offered to provide the boys with a reality experience about the judicial and penal systems through a visit to the Glynn County jail.

The primary activity for this program is intensive instruction in mathematics and language arts.

These subjects are the two basic areas which lead to academic failure. Instructing are successful African-American male faculty from all of the counties involved.

After completing the program, participants are involved in an ongoing follow-up period throughout the academic year. On the fourth Saturday of each month the Fourteen Black Men of Glynn are available for counsel with the youths and workshops for parents. Tutoring is also available on an "as needed" basis for the youths.
