Community forum informs on 2020 Vision

The 2020 community forum on Wednesday, March 18, 2009, gave the students, faculty and staff of the College the opportunity to hear more about the transformation of the school. Dr. Valerie A. Hepburn, president, spoke of a growing CCGA population and updated campus.

"The big boys are almost at their cap as far as new enrollment is concerned. We have to build a place that people will want to come," Dr. Hepburn said. Building that place includes lakeside residential housing, a Fine and Performing Arts Center, a Student Recreational Center and an expansion of parking. Some of the more immediate changes are campus-wide Wi-Fi capabilities and the removal of the asphalt within the campus by fall 2009.

Because of the partnership between the College and Southeast Georgia Health Systems, students, faculty and staff can also expect to receive healthcare services. A modular building, donated by SGHS, would serve as a temporary location, while the \$15.8 million Health and Sciences Building is being constructed. "Our nursing students will get some real world experience," said Dr. Hepburn. "And we will provide some primary care and behavioral health services and referrals."

During these tough economic times, many individuals are returning to school to change careers and compete in the job market. The College of Coastal Georgia is changing to meet those needs. "What we did 20 years ago is no longer meeting our needs," said Dr. Hepburn.
