Professor Authors New Book on Teaching Children with High Functioning Autism

Dr. Claire E. Hughes, Associate Professor of Education, has her second book now in print: Teaching Children with High Functioning Autism in the Inclusive Classroom." Directed at teachers, the book provides practical, hands-on strategies to work with children who have learning, social, and communication challenges.

The publisher, Prufrock Press, describes the book as providing "realistic descriptions of autism in the classroom, ideas for working with a wide range of professionals and integrating various therapies within a classroom, suggestions for assessing student learning, and range of teaching ideas from behavioral interventions to content-area instruction. College to Host Model United Nations

For over 30 years, the College of Coastal Georgia has been hosting the Model United Nations for Glynn County public and private schools. The 2011 Model UN program will be held December 15-16 in the Terrill Thomas Auditorium of the Southeast Georgia Conference Center on campus.

The program is a two-day diplomatic simulation. Students from area middle and high school play the role of delegates from United Nations' member states. The student participants develop skills in parliamentary procedure as well as gain knowledge about international affairs and organizations. The student delegates research the country they represent in the mock proceedings to be proficient in understanding the issues from that country's perspective.

The simulation includes mock sessions of the General Assembly and the Security Council. An Islamic Conference and an African Union will also caucus and debate policy. This year's resolution subject areas will be civil wars and regional conflicts, the UN and Asian economic development, and the UN and non-governmental organizations (NGOs).
